- At least one non-elderly adult (18-61) with a disability.
- Eligibility for Medicaid services or state-funded programs.

SMART Bus

- 50¢ one-way reduced fare on SMART & DDOT Fixed Route buses.
- \$1.00 one-way fare for SMART Connector general service.
